One of them brought a small box with a picture on it from our first prayer card in 2004. She handed it to us and then explained that she had been collecting change for us since the first time she met us and saw our ministry.

Perhaps the most unique thing about the night was learning that our children’s pediatrician and his wife, who live in Hendersonville, Tennessee, were married in the church in Houston and are good friends with the pastor.

Little Elysse became sick in Texas, and despite our efforts to treat her with the nebulizer and deep-suction machine, she had to be admitted to the hospital in Palm Desert, California, with pneumonia. This changed our plans for meetings in California, and it was with great disappointment that we had to cancel 3 of our meetings and make a very tiring 31-hour trip back to West Plains, Missouri. Praise the Lord, we made it safely. The many toll roads gave us easy opportunities to hand out tracts as we paid our tolls.

UGANDA MINISTRY:

We now have 48 new orphans in Kyotera. JJ’s ministry in Mbira is growing. It is a relief to me in knowing things are progressing well while we are in the States. A huge credit goes to Keith and Sally Stensaas, our partners in ministry in Uganda.
